
# The Sustainable Accessibility Framework

Effective accessibility requires three interconnected elements: technology, people, and process. When organizations get all three right, accessibility becomes:

- Embedded in their culture
- Not just a one-off project
- A path to long-term success



### Pitfalls To Avoid

### Technology + People (but no Process) = Inconsistent Execution

The team cares and has the tools, but without structure, accessibility efforts vary widely across projects.

### People + Process (but no Technology) = Aspirational but Ineffective

The team is aligned and committed, but lacks the technical solutions to turn intent into impact.

### Process + Technology (but no People) = Compliance without Commitment

Systems are in place, but no one feels responsible or invested. Accessibility becomes a checkbox, not a commitment.

# **Organizational Assessment**

This assessment will help you create an accessibility action plan that your team is more likely to follow through on. You will identify concrete steps for execution and have something valuable to share with colleagues. By revisiting this planning exercise regularly, you can celebrate your progress and maintain momentum over time.

### **SMART Goals**

Each section of the assessment uses SMART goals, which are specific, measurable, achievable, relevant, and time-bound. An example of a smart goal might look like this:

Within the next six weeks, the development team will complete accessibility testing of the checkout process using axe DevTools and NVDA, and fix at least 90% of identified WCAG 2.1 Level AA issues to improve usability for screen reader users and reduce cart abandonment.
